Alumni Award

Mrs. Leela Ramachandran Nair, Diploma batch of 1950 and PBBSc batch of 1971 was honoured with the Alumni award for her lifelong contribution and tireless effort in improving Nursing Education and Community Health Services in CMC Vellore. She worked in Community Health and Development (CHAD) till 1989 and then in Community Health Department, College of Nursing as Senior Tutor, till her retirement in 1992. After her retirement she joined the Father Muller's



College of Nursing where she worked till 1998. There she pioneered in setting up the Community Health Nursing Department, even before the inception of the Community Medicine Department. She was appreciated by the then Director, Father Bernard Moraes, currently the Archbishop of Bangalore, for in his quote "Bringing Vellore to Mangalore", in terms of academic training, integrating teaching and clinical work. After 1998 she served as visiting faculty at the Pushpagiri College of Nursing, Tiruvalla, and Lourde College of Nursing, Ernakulam at Kerala. Mrs. Nair is known for her meticulous planning and organization of patient care services and exemplary teaching skills.

Alumni Reunion and Workshop

The alumni reunion was conducted on 14th & 15th July 2017 on the theme 'Sharing Legacies'. Around 350 alumni attended the reunion. It was a good time of fellowship and reminiscence. Educational Programmes

Students' admission was done as usual with the two step process — entrance examination and interview. Currently a total of 961 students are on roll, with 399 in the BSc Nursing, 392 in GNM, 101 in PBBSc Nursing, 57 in MSc and 12 in Post Diploma Nursing programme.

A separate Post Graduate Nursing selection process was conducted this year as there was no institutional entrance examination for Medical Post graduate selection on the account of NEET. Entrance examination (online) for the Nursing PG courses were conducted in four centers (Delhi, Vellore, Guwahati & Kolkotta) and the step 2 process of practical test and interviews were conducted in Vellore. The process was completed smoothly and 29 students were admitted to various branches of MSc Nursing, 50 students to PBBSc Nursing, and 12 students to various Post Basic Diploma Nursing programmes.

Faculty have enrolled for the Part time PhD programmes under the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University and the National Consortium for PhD in Nursing under the Indian Nursing council. One completed her PhD and one faculty is awaiting her Public Viva Voce.

Student Learning and Feed Back

Passion for teaching and a constant drive to improve the quality of education has enabled the faculty to adopt different creative methods of teaching. Problem based learning was carried out for the M.Sc. (N) programme as one method of teaching. OSCE (Objective structured clinical examination) was introduced as a clinical evaluation method in all the departments for clinical teaching and clinical evaluation. To strengthen the uniformity in the conduction of OSCE, a workshop was arranged for all faculty on planning and conduction of OSCE. Review meetings were conducted by

the Dean for the first year students to improve their academic performance. Regular individual and class meetings were conducted by the respective class advisors and coordinators. The University has adopted OSCE as a part of the Practical examination from this academic year. To strengthen the classroom teachings and to bring about sound clinical practice the students were given opportunity to learn through simulation in the skill labs and through hands on practice in the wards and clinical areas of the hospital. The students were oriented to the primary and secondary health care systems in India through the experiences gained in Community Health and Secondary Hospital Exposure Programme. Feedback from the student and faculty served as a base for curriculum planning and implementation

Visiting / Observership Students and Faculty

There is an increase demand from Schools/Colleges of Nursing within the country and outside to visit our institution. This year 326 students and 5 faculty from 29 private, government and mission Schools / Colleges of Nursing within country and 29 students and 7 faculty from three International Universities visited our College.

One faculty from University of Coventry, UK and University of Kansas, USA, University of Seattle, Washington, USA and 21 faculty from Institute of Mental health, Kilpauk, Nagaarthanamma College of Nursing, Bangalore and Bethel Agricultural Fellowship, Salem visited our College for observership.

Scholarships

Scholarships are provided every year to deserving candidates. Institutional scholarships were offered to 97 undergraduate students. Elizabeth Gillespie Scholarship was awarded to three Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Students and one M.Sc. Nursing student. Donors from overseas, Services ASCN of SDA Pvt. Ltd., The Hope House, University of Washington, Om Sakthi Narayani Siddar Peedam Trust, and H.M. Trust contributed towards the scholarship fund.

Campus Development

The roads are paved which has given a face lift to the whole campus.. Two RO water plants have been installed. Trees are planted in the whole campus. Sports and games fields are on the progress of development.

Student Nurture

The students are nurtured and guided in the College and hostel by the class advisors and wardens. Regular Bible classes and retreats are conducted by Chaplaincy department for all batches. A counselor is available every day in the hostel for their

need. The counseling classes (once a month) by the counselor along with the Bible classes is being continued which the students find very useful. Foster parent and foster batch scheme also helps in building relationships. Various other religious programmes like Tuesday fellowship, chapel services, Teaching Mission and SHILOH in the institution are a source of support for the growth of each student. A staff nurse is available on health call duty at nights to meet any emergency health needs of the students and one nurse caters to the needs of the students who visit the staff student clinic.

Nursing Students Hostel

The UG block of the new Nursing Students' Hostel has 145 rooms and accommodates 580 students. The PG block has 150 rooms and will accommodate 302 students. At present total of 756 students are housed in the Nursing Students hostel. Accommodation is arranged with 4 students in each room in the UG block and 2 in each room in the PG block. The staffing consists of 5 assistant wardens, 5 cooks (hospital attendants) and 2 hospital attendants. The maintenance and cleaning is done by the Red Sky contractors.

RO water facility had been newly installed in the kitchen for cooking purpose this year. 84 numbers of metal three seater chairs were bought and placed in the floors of the hostel. 24 cameras were fixed in the hostel. Six guest rooms were furnished with new furniture, TV, and other amenities. 48 special functions were catered during the year in addition to the regular catering. A new Television, LCD projector, UPS and a podium are new facilities added in the recreation hall. Two

Gyms with Treadmill, Elliptical Trainer, Vinyl dumbbells, Gym ball etc was also added this year. Space to play Volley ball and Throw ball was allotted in front of the hostel.



Awards & Prizes

The nursing students (Men) won the second place in volley ball, football, 400 meters relay and track events during Pegasus. Twenty seven students from the college of nursing participated in the Inter Nursing College sports meet conducted by the Tamil nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University hosted by KG College of Nursing, Coimbatore and won the third place in 400 meters relay. Students participated in the integrated sports and games organized by CMC from March 12th

 -15^{th} 2018 and won the first place in throw ball (women) and in volley ball (men). Runners in basketball, table tennis and Shuttle Badminton.

Students had participated in the South Zone Intercollegiate quiz competition-Zenith- 2017 conducted by PSG College of nursing, Coimbatore. Our students won the first prize among five teams which headed to finals. Since this is the third consecutive win the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore is the recipient of the rolling trophy is obtained permanently. Conference

CONFEST 2018, a Mega Event for the Nursing Students in India, was conducted by the College of Nursing. It was a three day event comprising of a seminar and cultural-cum-sports meet, and it was heralded as the first of its kind. The seminar held on the first day, focused on the theme 'Values Enrich Education, Ethics Strengthens it'. Mrs. Evelyn P. Kannan, Secretary General of TNAI, Chief Guest for the Inaugural ceremony, stressed upon the need of amalgamation of values and ethics in education and challenged the younger generation to take pride in their profession while carrying it forward to greater heights. An impressive total of 995 students of 35 colleges from 9 different States participated in this mega event. The second day opened up a platform to showcase the talents of the young budding nurses. A total of 12 competitions and a Quiz were held at various venues. Dr. Rohit Amritanand, Deputy Medical Superintendent, CMC, graced the Sports Meet on the third day and felicitated the gathering. 

II.STUDENT INFORMATION

A total of 873 students are on roll during this academic year, 2018-2019. M.Sc - 54, PBBSc - 99, BSc - 395, GNM - 297, and Post Basic Diploma Nursing - 28. Part time PhD programme is also offered in the College under the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R.Medical University and through the National Consortium for PhD in Nursing under the Indian Nursing council.

Student Teaching Learning

Passion for teaching and a constant drive to improve the quality of education has enabled the faculty to adopt different creative methods of teaching. Problem based

learning and E -learning were used. OSCE (Objective structured clinical examination) was introduced by the University for assessment.

To strengthen the classroom teachings and to bring about sound clinical practice, the students were given opportunity to learn through simulation in the skill labs and through hands on practice in the wards and clinical areas of the hospital. The students were oriented to the primary and secondary health care systems in India through the experiences gained in Community Health and Secondary Hospital Visit Programme. Feedback from the students and faculty served as a base for curriculum planning and implementation.

Special initiatives and efforts are taken to guide and counsel students who have difficulty in coping with hostel life, academics and clinical. Referrals for special counselling are made possible as and when required.

Formulation of Bioethics Curriculum

Initiating the bioethics department was proposed during the Consultation 2016. The Fundamentals of Nursing Department coordinates the activities related to Bioethics. The CON Bioethics core committee members participate in the meetings held every month in the Institution to discuss bioethical issues. A curriculum on Bioethics has been formulated. Seven Faculty have registered for an Online Bioethics course under UNESCO Bioethics Chair.

Visiting Students and Faculty

Four students from Kansas University, USA spent three weeks in Community Health Nursing, Accident & Emergency Nursing, Cardio Thoracic Nursing, Neurological Nursing, and Obstetrics & Gynaecology Nursing clinical areas. Four students and one Co-ordinator from University of Pennsylvania, USA spent a week in Community Health (CONCH, CHAD), Psychiatric, Oncology. Neurologic, and Paediatric and Maternity Nursing clinical areas. Also, faculty and staff from Dhulikhel Hospital, Kathmandu, Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Maharashtra, Kalinga Institute of Nursing Sciences, Bhubaneswar and North Carolina Central University, Durham visited our College to observe the integration model and to gain insight in the clinical services provided in the main hospital and community health settings.

We had visiting students from 10 private, 10 Government, and 3 Mission institutions during this year.

. The Community Health Nursing Department has been actively involved in providing health services in the

rural, urban and tribal communities. A total of 30,070 urban population (Ramanaikanpalayam, Kansalpet), 3,25,547 of rural population (CHAD, RUHSA and CONCH) and 60000 tribal population(Jawadi Hills) are being served by the Department of Community Health Nursing.

DOTS clinic is conducted in OPD of CMC Hospital and Family Development programme for CMC staff is conducted at Kaspa and Byrelane. The DOTS drugs for Urban and CONCH patients are distributed by the Community Health Nursing staff in their homes/clinics. Sputum tests are done and contact examination and screening are done for the family members of the TB clients

New Services Initiated

- Geriatric Clubs: Two new geriatric clubs were inaugurated in Kilminnel village and Perumugai village this year.
- ENT Clinic: Organized with ENT II unit of CMC, Vellore from July 2018 on Tuesdays and Thursdays every month. Screening is done to identify hearing loss and other ear abnormalities by an audiologist. Referrals are made to ENT OPD, CMC, and the patients are followed up by Community Health Nurses.

Extension of CONCH services: CONCH services were extended to one more new area, Gambarajapuram Colony with a total population of 597 and 124 families

- CONCH Kannigapuram Outreach Clinic will be inaugurated on 9th of July, 2019 started as an expansion of CONCH primary health care services into secondary health care services and also as a felt need of the villagers of in and around Kannigapuram. A house on the high way has been taken for rent and is being renovated so as to conduct clinics on Tuesdays and Fridays by the doctors from CHAD and LCECU and on the other days by the CONCH Nursing staff.
- Toilet construction in a Government High School at Kilminnel Village: As part of the 75th anniversary celebration of the Kilminnel

Government High School, the school management requested CMC to construct toilets for their students in the school premises. Hence four female toilets, two male toilets and five urinals were constructed at the cost of Rs. 5,07,025.

- Career Guidance Centre: A center for career guidance was inaugurated in the month of March 2019 at RUHSA.
- Health Camps: Five health camps were organized by the Department of Community Health Nursing in collaboration with various Departments of CMC.


College Day Celebrations


Dedication of Sports Ground in the Kagithapattarai Campus

V.SCHOLARLY ACTIVITIES:

Conferences and Workshops

National Perioperative Conference

The First National Perioperative Nursing Conference was hosted on the 19th



and 20th of November, 2018 on the theme "Improving Patient Safety in the Perioperative Setting". There were 417 delegates from 16 states. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. Sailaxmi Gandhi, Head of Nursing, NIMHANS, Bengaluru. The conference had six plenary sessions on diverse domains of patient safety. Renowned international and national

speakers threw light on the recent trends in patient safety, need for nursing informatics, legal issues in operating rooms. postoperative care to minimize complications and on continuous quality improvement.

Nurses League National Conference

The 70th National Conference of the Nurses League, CMAI was hosted by College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore from 22nd to 24th October 2018. The theme for this year was "Hope in Distress". A total of four hundred and twenty participants representing forty institutions from sixteen states



attended the conference. The Chief Guest for the inaugural ceremony was Dr. Ani Grace Kalaimathi, Registrar of the Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council, who stressed on the importance of touch in patient care. The key note address which was a reflection on the theme and the session on the "Extended Role of Nurses in the Ministry of Healing" were deeply motivating. The academic sessions on "Climatic Changes- its Impact on Health" and "Mobile Nurse Mentoring Project, Bihar - the Unique Challenge Deserving a Unique Approach" were indeed a very valuable experience. Unique Approach".

Short Courses

Distance Education on Stoma Care Nursing: Distance Education on Stoma care Nursing, organized by the Department of CNE & Research and the Department of Surgical Nursing had four participants from New Delhi, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. Online modules were uploaded in the CMC E-learning website and each student was given an individual password to access the content.

Course on Research Methodology: A short course on Research Methodology was conducted this year. Thirty two participants including students and faculty from three different states namely Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu attended the course.

Ph.D. Consortium activities

The College of Nursing is one of the 7 nodal centres in the country for the National consortium for PhD in nursing under INC, affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University, Bangalore. Ph.D activities such as Synopsis presentation, Proposal Presentation, Pre PhD Examination, Contact classes, Student Seminar presentations, Academic review committee meetings and Core committee meeting were carried out in the CNE class room using video conferencing facilities. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean College of Nursing and Dr. Premila Lee, Nursing Superintendent are the Academic Committee members of the National Ph.D Consortium.who contribute towards decision making and serve as faculty for the contact classes.

Journal Publication and Module Preparation

Apart from publishing two issues of Indian Journal of Continuing Education (IJCNE) from January to June 2018 and July to December 2018, the

CNE department holds Editorial and Advisory board meetings regularly. Currently there are 1047 Individual and Institutional subscribers from 28 Indian states. 61 participants took the Continuing Education Test (Test No: 33), of which 12 secured a 100%. All the participants of the CE test who scored above 80% were awarded 2 credit hours.

OSCE

OSCE online Module was created the department of CNE and hosted in LM Excellence platform (private firm for online learning) as an open access in the community portal as a test module. Invitation to take the course free of cost was sent to about 500 nurses. Thirty nurses/students took the course and got certified.

WHO Collaborating Centre

College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore continues to be as WHO Collaborating Centre for Nursing and Midwifery till November 2021.

Capacity Building of Nursing Personnel, Directorate of Health Services, Madhya Pradesh:

MOU between the College of Nursing and Director of Health Services, Madhya Pradesh (DOHS, MP) have been initiated in March 2015 to assist in the Capacity Building of the nursing cadre in Critical Care, Oncology Nursing, Emergency and Trauma Nursing, Renal Nursing, Cardiac Critical care Nursing, OR Nursing, through developing three months short term courses. This year totally 181 staff nurses were trained in six groups.

Capacity Building in Strengthening of Emergency and Disaster Nursing

Using WHO Disaster Management guidelines, training programmes were conducted. The CON is recognized by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University and the Government of TamilNadu as the Resource Center for training nurses in emergency and disaster management. Two day workshop was conducted for the final year undergraduate and PG nursing students to prepare them in being effective workforce during disaster. A total of 273 students were trained.

Two Faculty participated in the Asia Pacific Emergency and Disaster Nursing Network (APEDNN) core group meetings and also in the Conference held at Cambodia.

The Department of Emergency Nursing and the CNE of CON took the initiative in preparing the online teaching material on disaster management and have submitted to the TamilNadu State Nursing council

Research Activities

A Survey on Nurse Migration is undertaken by Loyola Institute of Social Science Training and Research (LISSTAR), Institute of Developing Economics

(IDEJETRO), Japan and College of Nursing, CMC Vellore. The Centre for Development Studies (CDS), Trivandrum provides technical help. The study is conducted to explore the socio economic background of nursing students, their motivation to join nursing course, future career prospects, investigate career development of nurses and factors, processes and consequences of nurse international migration.

One faculty is the co-investigator in the study on "comparison of intravenous and perineural dexamethasone IN Ultra-sound guided Paravertebral Block in Pediatric Patient Undergoing Open Pyeloplasty: A Prospective Double – Blinded Randomized Clinical Study".

The College of Nursing Research Committee met 3 times during this year. Six of our faculty serve in the Institutional Review Board of CMC. 21 Faculty research studies were approved last year of which 4 are coinvestigators. 29 M.Sc Students' research studies were reviewed last year by the CON Research and Ethics Committee.

Innovations

Ms S. W. Naomi Nancy, Lecturer in Medical Surgical Nursing Specialty invented a pharyngeal feeding bottle, which was modified from the existing nasal douching bottle. It is in use in the ward for post maxillectomy patients.

Nursing Service Endeavours and Achievements

1. Tamil Nadu Accident and Emergency Care Initiative programme (TAEI):

Nursing Service was given the opportunity to train nurses from the Government sector in Trauma Care at our institution. This well appreciated programme by the participants and Government officials paved way to develop and implement Trauma Care Management protocol in the Government hospitals across the state of Tamil Nadu.

Following the success of the two week comprehensive training program for 165 government nurses at Emergency Department, the Government of Tamil Nadu once again collaborated with Nursing Service to conduct

- 30 days TAEI Master Trainers Training in Emergency Care exclusively for District Trauma Nurse Coordinators (DNTCs) and 24 DTNCs were trained in the month of June 2018.
- Two day orientation observership for TAEI Nursing Superintendent and DTNCs was conducted and 142 members were trained between July and September 2018.

2. Clinical Initiatives:

- OR Pooling: For effective utilization of OR facilities, pooling facility was introduced for optimizing flow of patients in and out of OR. Three Nurse Transfer Coordinators work in two shifts between 7:00 a.m and 10:00 p.m.
- Online Discharge Process: Nursing Service coordinated with Billing Section to introduce Chart Free billing service to reduce time taken for the IP bill preparation and hassle free discharge of staff and patients from the hospital.
- Night Supervisor: To ensure continuity and uniformity in management during night a full time Night supervisor was appointed.

- Bio Medical equipment: All Bio medical equipment used in the wards are brought under Nursing Service inventory and maintenance to initiate uniform charging as well as to save nursing time in entering the bio medical equipment charges for each patient.
- Inter department knowledge share: As new services were initiated efforts were taken to train nurses in the specific areas. For example Staff nurses from A1 ward and Pediatric department were trained on Hemodialysis and Peritoneal dialysis in AK lab for two weeks and posted along with Nephrology transplant coordinator for a period of one week.

- Breast Care Nurse specialist participated in General Medical camp conducted by CMC Chittoor campus in Mapakshi area and displayed models, posters and pamphlets and spoke on early detection, risk factors, sign and symptoms, protective factors, breast self-examination and management of cancer breast.
- Services of occupational health nurse practitioner (OHNP): The
 OHNP is posted in the Staff Health Services and at the Shalom Family
 Medicine Center, her activities include pre-employment checkup and
 vaccination, Annual medical checkup, Hepatitis B vaccination,
 assessment, treatment referral, recording and reporting.
- CMC Emergency Care at Katpadi Railway Station continues to provide appropriate assessment and optimal care to the patients in the railway stations. About 320 Trauma and 880 non trauma patients were treated in the last year.
- Liver Transplant Coordinator conducted Organ awareness programme at the Employees Provident Fund Organization, Sathuvachari.
- Injury Prevention Camp for wardens in Central Jail, Vellore and in APCA was conducted by Emergency team where our nurses actively participated.
- RT OPD staff participated in the monthly Medical camps in Anaicut block, Vellore. Apart from these they also participated in the meeting organized for survivors of Breast Cancer, Cancer Cervixt and Head and neck surgery
- To propagate awareness among the general public on Breast Cancer prevention, a walkathon was organized from CMC hospital campus to South Police station
- Medical nursing dept. organized outreach programme to conduct health education and health checkup at Kilithanpattarai village, Katpadi .They also organized a 'Puppet Show' and Video show on 'Prevention and First Aid' for Snake bite in Chukuvar Palli Village, Chittoor on World Snake bite Awareness day
- A video on Glaucoma prepared by Schell Eye hospital nurses was presented on Glaucoma awareness day. Also regular weekly Eye camps were conducted in and around Vellore

Staff Nurses in LCECU conduct regular home visits in and around Vellore and also participate in Community Rehabilitation and School health programme

PALS program was conducted at Gredi Gutperle Agasthiyar Muni Children & Maternity Hospital, Kanyakumari by the PICU team and nurses took active part in training the staff.

iv. Disaster Management- CMC Response Team

The year 2018-2019 faced significant natural fury in the form of Cyclone and Floods. The Emergency department co-ordinated the relief efforts and multiple teams were sent based on the need.

Kerala flood : The Emergency Nursing team with five Staff Nurses played a significant role in the Flood response and relief. Of the flood affected areas in Kerala in August 2018



CMC response team with five Staff took materials like food items, water, clothes, toiletries and medicines to the affected places of Nagapattinam during the cyclone in November 2018

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT **Staff Position**

At present, Nursing Service has 2981 nursing staff on roll. A total of 251 nurses were recruited from our institution and 57 through CBT programme.



Continuing Nursing Education

Nursing Service organized various in-service, in-house training and workshops for nurses to help them update their skills and also to train them in all mandatory topics as required by the accreditation bodies.

Regular In-house and In-service training

- Induction programme: 12 induction programme of three days was conducted for new graduate nurses and new recruits in the last year.
- CPR Training: 46 workshops were conducted in this year, where 1628 underwent training and 1601 were certified in the last year.
- PALS workshop: 5 workshops were conducted and 173 nurses were certified in the last year.
- Advanced Cardiovascular Life support (ACLS) training programme: 5 workshops was conducted and 170 nurses working in critical care areas were certified in the last year.
- IV Therapy: 21 workshops were conducted and 764 nurses were certified

- Nursing Excellence Standards for Quality Patient Care: 46 inhouse participants and 20 from other institutions who attended and were benefited.
- 5th Short Course in Hospital Infection Control for Nurses: 45 delegates registered, representing 21 different hospitals from 8 states across India.

Clinical workshops

Nursing Service liaised with individual nursing departments to organize the 19 workshops specific to their work area.

External workshops

Apart from the in-house training programmes conducted by the Nursing Service, Staff were deputed and sponsored to attend various workshops and training program conducted within and outside the institution.

- i. Nursing Service sponsored five nurses for each workshop and deputation leave was given for more staff to attend workshops conducted by the Department of Continuing Nursing Education, College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore.
- ii. To equip and develop nurses to contribute more in the current role, they were sponsored to attend workshops conducted in other health care organizations.

Workshops, Webinars and Seminars

Various workshops, e- seminars and webinars were conducted virtually.

Webinars were conducted in collaboration with Christian Medical Association of India on different topics that were assessed as felt needs through an online survey.

Short term Courses

A Distance education course on 'Stoma Care Nursing' was organized from August – November 2019 to train registered nurses in specialized care. A short course on 'Peritoneal Dialysis" was conducted for the first time from January 15 to February 14, 2020. There were totally two participants one from AIIMS, New Delhi and the other an alumnus of Government Vellore Medical College.

Ph.D. Programme

Six faculty are in the process of registering for PhD in Nursing, under Dr.MGR Medical University, Chennai. Three faculty were selected for the PhD programme under the National Consortium for PhD in Nursing by the Indian Nursing Council

Journal Publication

The Indian Journal of Continuing Education (IJCNE) published by the College of Nursing is made an online journal in partnership with the Medknow, part of Wolter's and Kluwer's Health. The first online issue was published in August 2019. The journal is accessible at http://www.ijcne.org/aboutus.asp. Special issue for this year was done to commemorate the 50 years of Masters in nursing education and 25 years of Ph.D in nursing in our institution.

KUMC Modale Junior Faculty Research Scholarship Programme

Two faculty, Mrs. Naomi Nancy and Mrs. Priya Chandrasekar were awarded the Modale Junior faculty research scholarship and had four months experience in Kansas University from 31/7/19 to 15/12/19.

Senior training Fellowship Programme

Mrs. Rebecca SumathiBai was able to pursue her training on Stroke Rehabilitation as visitor observer at Long Island, Manhasset, New York for a period of four weeks from mid October to mid November 2019.

Research Activities

Twenty three faculty research projects are being undertaken. Faculty and students presented their research during the Annual Research Day held in the Institution and have won prizes.

Two research proposals are being developed in collaboration with the Kansas University USA. Dr. Manoranjitham Sathiyaseelan participated in the systematic review under Mental Health Gap Action Programme (MHGAP) of the WHO aiming to explore treatment – seeking behaviors of people living with depression, schizophrenia and epilepsy in low and middle - income countries

A collaborative research with Birmingham City University, UK on "Diabetes in Mentally ill" a Community based study is being developed.

A virtual student exchange programme is being prepared to be held as a collaborative educational exchange programme to learn on Global Health/Population based health care focused from local to Global level between College of Nursing, CMC Vellore and School of Nursing, University of Kansas, US.

Simulation lab

We have received USAID ASHA Grant 2019 for development of an advanced skill lab for nursing students. An additional amount of Rupees 50 lakhs need to be raised towards the infrastructure development and maintenance of the facility.

Community Outreach activities during Covid Pandemic

College of Nursing Community Health (CONCH), Kannigapuram Outreach Clinicwasinauguratedon9thJuly2019, to provide secondary level health care services to the people of Kannigapuram and the surrounding 25 villages where CONCH services are being provided.

The community health nursing department is involved in health screening of the construction workers of the Kannigapuram Campus. Mobile nurse led clinics and cervical cancer screening for women in the reproductive age are carried out in CONCH and Urban areas. Packed medicines were delivered for free of cost at the doorstep for all the morbid patients covered by the Community Health Department during the pandemic.



Services of Occupational Health Nurse Practitioner (OHNP)

The Nursing Students Hostel Health Clinic (NSH-HC) service was initiated and started functioning since 01.08.2019. This NSH Clinic enables the nursing students to get their health services in the hostel premise through the OHNP. SSHS continues to see students who are in need of further management.

Services of Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) - Shalom Family Medicine Centre

The activities of FNP in the Shalom Family Medicine Centre which caters to the citizens of Vellore city include assessment, treatment, referral, health education and counseling

Activities as a WHO collaborating center for Nursing and Midwifery (WHOCCNM)

College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore continues to be as WHO Collaborating Centre for Nursing and Midwifery. MOU between the College of Nursing and Director of Health Services, Madhya Pradesh (DOHS, MP) have been initiated in March 2015 to assist in the capacity building of the nursing cadre through developing three months short term courses. This year totally 93 staff nurses were trained in two groups. The MOU has been renewed for another two years i.e. 2020 & 2021.

Using WHO Disaster Management guidelines, training programmes were conducted. The CON is recognized by the Tamil NaduDr.M.G.R. Medical University and the Government of TamilNadu as the Resource Center for training nurses in emergency and disaster management. Two day workshop was conducted to final year undergraduate nursing students and PG students to prepare them as an effective workforce during disaster.

Pre Shiloh conference workshop on 'Nursing Competencies for Disaster Management' was conducted on 26th September 2019 for nursing students studying in various mission hospitals across the country.

A short video on the activities of the Community health nursing department was prepared and sent for the "Health for All Film Festival" organized by WHO. The photo sent for the "World Health Day 2020" Photo competition organized by WHO Regional Office for South East Asia region was selected as one of the top three winners. The center has shared few case studies for the Link Magazine of WHO.

As part of the International Year of Nurses and Midwife 2020 celebration, the National Institute of Health and family Welfare (NIHFW) conducted an Online Training course on Building Nursing and Midwifery Leadership for achieving UHC/SDG, the Director of WHOCC NM presented a talk on "Leadership for building and sustaining Model Nursing and Midwifery

management practices: integration of teaching and services" on 8th October 2020.

Indian Nursing Council in collaboration with the UNFPA (United Nations Population Fund) organized a virtual capacity building program for the midwifery faculty in the Schools and Colleges of Nursing in India. Mrs.Ebenezer Ellen serves as a resource faculty for the TOT programme for strengthening reproductive, maternal and neonatal health services by nurse practitioners in midwifery (NPMs) through Midwife Led Care Units (MLCUs).

Jhpiego in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), INC and State Government conducted a webinar on "Investing in Nursing Education, Jobs and Leadership in India: Committing to a decade of action" .Mrs.Alice Sony ,Deputy Dean made a presentation on "Integration of Nursing Education and Service and Nurse Led Community Based Care".

Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean College of Nursing participated in the Eigth WHO-ICN-ICM Triad meeting held on June 16 to 18,2020. The focus of the meeting was strengthening nursing and midwifery in the context of Covid -19 leveraging the findings from the State of the World's Nursing report and new evidence on midwifery, and identifying priorities for the next strategic directions for nursing and midwifery.

Student teaching and learning

Passion for teaching and a constant drive to improve the quality of education has enabled the faculty to adopt different creative methods of teachingespecially during this year of pandemic.

Activities during COVID 19 pandemic

Due to the lockdown pronounced by the Government of India, students were sent home. However, Online teaching programmes of all level of nursing students are continuing to be held due to the COVID-19 pandemic situation.

The institution is involved in country's response to COVID-19 through establishing systems, capacity buildings and COVID-19 information dissemination. The nursing faculty and staff as frontline workers in the COVID -19 pandemic are involved in planning and setting up of wards to admit COVID patients, screening, training of nursing personnel and patients on the management and prevention of COVID-19.

Faculty research projects on Psychological impact of COVID -19, Knowledge, attitude and practice, Level of satisfaction and communication on COVID-19, Compassion satisfaction and Fatigue among Oncology nurses, Experiences of Midwife caring for women in COVID wards, nurse managers' clinical management decision making process in pandemic situation, perceived social support and stigma among patients with COVID 19 infection, fear and resilience of nurses working in COVID 19 areas are being undertaken.

Workshops

Nine intravenous therapy workshops were organized and 307 staff participated. Thirteen workshops on basic lifesupport, 6 workshops on advancedlifesupport and 2 workshops on paediatric basic life support were organized by the Office of the Nursing Superintendent and 746 staff were certified.

Thirty in-house workshops were organized by the Office of the Nursing Superintendent in collaboration with the clinical departments. Participants were awarded 5 credit hours by the

Tamilnadu Nurses and Midwives Council. Each department ensured that all of their staff attended the workshops relevant to their clinical area.

Hospital Management in COVID 19 crisis

COVID19 Pandemic has created an enormous impact in the normal functioning of the institution. The hospital was recognized as the center for screening and caring for patients with COVID 19 since mid-March.Part of the hospital wards were converted to cater to patients affected byCOVID.Around 99 beds were converted for managing critical ill. A fever clinic was opened to enable outpatient care to COVID 19 suspects.. Nurses were trained to take swabs to facilitate quick testing and monitoring.

Policies and protocols were laid to ensure prevention and spread of transmission of the disease. COVID care area and the regular clinical areas were delinked.

The nurses were trained in donning and doffing and in managing critically illwhich enabledthemtoprovidecritical care confidently. A total of 1200 staff nurses were trained to provide care to patients affected by COVID-19. 200 staff nurses were trained to provide level III Critical Care to COVID patients. Online webinars were conducted on management and prevention of COVID-19 and modules of the same were distributed to mission hospitals. Appropriate and adequate staffing of all area with optimal utilization of manpower was ensured.

Continuous appreciation to our frontline nurses working in COVID care areas from the patients and the administration is a boon to all our staff. The commitment, courage and compassion of our staff nurses were highly commendable. The patient satisfaction survey done by the quality management cell showed that the satisfaction of nursing care was 100%.

New Orthopedic Block

The old Student Nurses' Hostel "Our glass palace" is being replaced with a new initiative to expand the services to the orthopedic patients. It has 11 theatres with 20 day care beds, a 12 bedded HDU and 3 wards with 105 beds. This facility will be inaugurated soon.

Chittoor Campus

Chittoor campus continues to expand with additional new inpatient services such as Labour Room with 5 beds, Perinatal ward with 20 beds and Nursery with 10 beds. Outpatient services like Wound management clinic, Urology OPD, Infertility Clinic, Psychiatry Counselling, Paediatric Surgery and day care facilities for surgical units known as "Exodus ward" have been initiated. A COVID care ward was opened to treat the COVID positive patients.

Workshops

Five intravenous therapy workshops were organized and 107 staff participated. Twenty four workshops on basic life support, 5 workshops on advanced life support, 4 workshops on Paediatric basic life support, 1 workshop on Pediatric Advanced life support were organized by the Office of the Nursing Superintendent and 787 staff were certified.

Fifteen in-house workshops were organized by the Office of the Nursing Superintendent in collaboration with the clinical departments. Hands on training on non invasive ventilation ,Defibrillation and Neonatal resuscitation was conducted Training on Adult and Pediatric Covid preparedness was conducted and 204 staff participated. Each department ensured that all of their staff attended the workshops relevant to their clinical area.

Hospital Management in COVID 19 crisis

COVID19 Pandemic has created an enormous impact in the normal functioning of the institution. The hospital was recognized as the center for screening and caring for patients with COVID 19 since mid-March.Part of the hospital wards were converted to cater to patients affected byCOVID.Around 99 beds were converted for managing critical ill. A fever clinic was opened to enable outpatient care to COVID 19 suspects.. Nurses were trained to take swabs to facilitate quick testing and monitoring.

Policies and protocols were laid to ensure prevention and spread of transmission of the disease. COVID care area and the regular clinical areas were delinked.

Appropriate and adequate staffing of all area with optimal utilization of manpower was ensured. Continuous appreciation to our frontline nurses working in COVID care areas from the patients and the administration is a boon to all our staff. The commitment, courage and compassion of our staff nurses were highly commendable.

Vaccination for COVID-19: The first phase in CMC began on the 20th January 2021, free of cost from the Government for health care workers. In Phase 2, the Government made the vaccine available on a subsidised basis for the vulnerable population of 60 years and above and those above 45 years with co-morbidities. In all, we had together given more than 25000 doses of CovishieldTM (the Oxford- AstraZeneca vaccine, manufactured in India by M / s Serum Institute of India - SII) and CovaxinTM (Indigenously developed vaccine manufactured by M/s Bharath Biotech Pvt Ltd, in India) with no major adverse events recorded from January to April 2021.

New Orthopedic Block

The old Student Nurses' Hostel "Our glass palace" is being replaced with a new initiative to expand the services to the orthopedic patients. It has 11 theatres with 20 day care beds, a 12 bedded HDU and 3 wards with 105 beds. This facility was dedicated on May 3rd 2021. The Collector of Vellore, Mr. A. Shanmuga Sundaram I.A.S., in the presence of CMC Director, Dr. J. V. Peter and various other key officials who attended in person or virtually, inaugurated the Paul Brand Block
