CC/B.Sc./ 01-2022. Students' Feed Back:

Feedback received (through google forms) from students regarding classroom teaching, clinical experience and Hostel life was shared.

CC/B.Sc./ 03-2022. Master Plan:

Master plan for the academic year 2022-2023 was presented.

- Mrs. Sonia Sabu, Professor conveyed that the II year B.Sc. Nursing students to be posted five weeks in Main OR and one week in PB OR. She also requested to avoid overlapping of B.Sc. and GNM students.
- Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean, informed the faculty that the simulation lab will be opened for students practice by November 2022. She also insisted the faculty to plan internal practical exam well ahead of time.
- Mrs. Amalorpavamari Lucas, Professor suggested that the same teachers can take Medical surgical Nursing -I classes for the II year B.Sc. Nursing students. The faculty discussed about various advantages and disadvantages. After a short period of

discussion, it was decided that the same teachers can take the same systems for both the groups to ensure uniformity. However, Dr. Vathsala Sadan insisted that it requires lot of coordination between the faculty to meticulously plan the classes and to avoid classes being missed. She also expressed that this academic year it will be a trial, if it goes smoothly the same plan can be implemented in the future.

4. Dr. Vinitha Ravindran, Professor asked for clarification with regard to Medical Surgical Nursing Master plan whether the clinical rotations can just mention as Medical Surgical Nursing and the departments can plan the rotation internally. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean, explained that Medical Surgical areas are quite extensive and it will cause lot of confusion and difficulty in students completing clinical requirements.

5. Mrs. Ilavarasi Jesudoss, Professor clarified the reason for extra hours provided for II year Medical Surgical Nursing clinical experience. Mrs. Angelin Esther, Addl. Dy. Dean, explained that even with 140 hours of extra clinical experience, 100 students are unable to complete their clinical requirements in General Medical Surgical Nursing. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean, asked the class advisors view point on the same. II year class advisors (Mrs. Arockiaseli Mabel and Ms. Hepsi R) also expressed that they require extra hours to complete the clinical requirements.

6. Mrs. Angelin Esther, Addl. Dy. Dean, presented Master Plan of two types. One with partial block class and clinical, second plan with 8 hours of clinical experience and block class. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean, asked the members to decide on student's clinical experience. Faculty members expressed that 8 hours of clinical experience to Ranipet campus will be comfortable and convenient for both the faculty and the students.

7. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean insisted that the Pharmacology and Pathology Co-Ordinator's to attend the classes and ensure adequate number of tests are given to prepare students to appear for University examination.

8. Dr. Manoranjitham S, Professor verbalized that the faculty from Mental Health Nursing can be given 8 to 10am class instead of 10.30 to 12.30 pm. She also expressed that more than 75 students are posted in MHC. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean suggested to explore to utilize outside areas such as Old Age Homes, Destitute Homes and Orphanages as clinical experiences. She also encouraged to use these areas to complete clinical requirements like Mental Status Examinations, Psychometric assessment and Counseling of the vulnerable population to decongest the clinical area.

9. Mrs. Alice Sony, Professor expressed that 15 weeks is not sufficient to complete the clinical requirements of all the level of Nursing students. Dr. Vathsala Sadan, Dean recommended to use simulation lab which will be available in the near future. She also explained that in the Revised B.Sc. Nursing syllabus, the conduction of delivery number has been reduced to 10.


10. Dr. Vinitha Ravindran, Professor also recommended that all the meetings can be planned as Luncheon meetings or after duty hours so that the faculty will not miss the classes. She also suggested whether the class timing can be 8-1 pm and 2-5 Pm. Dean asked the opinion of the faculty and there was no consensus regarding change of duty hours.

11. Retest policy: The class advisors and the teachers were asked about the policy of retest. After a brief discussion, it was decided that retest will not be provided for students from this academic year. The teachers expressed that it becomes a habit as well as burden for students. The students writing retest are not able to concentrate on regular tests:



Clinical Experience

- We need more clinical teaching at the bed side.
- Teachers need to help in completion of the procedures
- Teachers are too much busy with their professional responsibilities. Sometimes very difficult to approach. It will be good if teachers individually know their students and be sensitive in solving issues regarding studies or clinical experience.
- BSC tutors are not treating us with respect.
- Maternity-- demonstration of mechanism of labour not good

- The cooler which is kept in every floor, if it is repaired will be useful to get drinking water inside the hostel than buying water from outside.
- Include PG students also in Hostel General body meeting. Because we are not getting any update about what is happening in hostel.
- PG Block entrance door to be kept opened for PG students.




